In order to honor its legislative spirit and implement the spirit of the Archives Act, promote public access to the archives, and optimally develop the evidential functions of archives in administrative and historical aspects of archives, according to the regulations of Archives Act, we collect and transfer the government agency archives which have to be permanently preserved. We also accept donations, trusteeship and acquisition of valuable documents from private sectors to ensure the archives worthy of with long term preservation value to be properly stored preserved and to be utilized after charting description, arrangement and conservation. Up to now, 21 categories of approximately 23.6 kilometers of archives are collected by National Archives Administration, including those related with government policies, interior affairs, judicial and legal affairs, legislative and control affairs.

To facilitate public access to the archives, the latest information about the national archives has been provided since 2010 by the quarterly the National Archives Newsletter. A total of 924.125 m length of archives (10 major categories) was preserved between July and September, 2019. The source agencies, content summaries, information period and lengths of these acquisitions are listed in the table below:

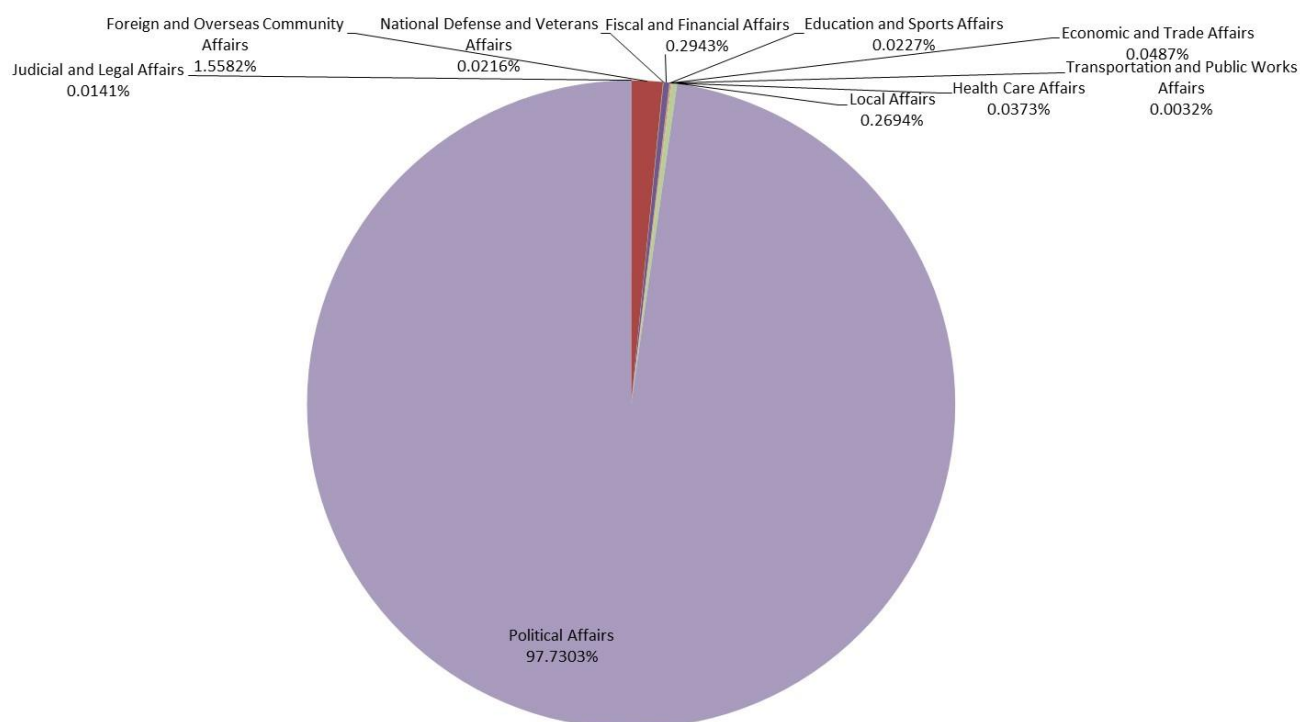

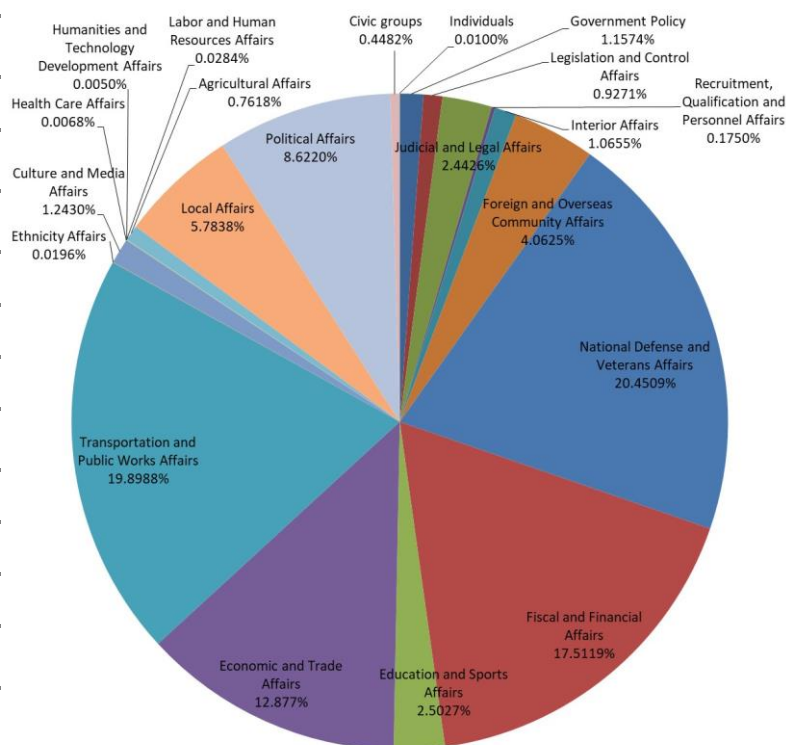
The quantity and ratio of new archives under each category collected in July - September, 2019 are illustrated in the pie chart and the table below:

As of September, 30th, 2019, the National Archives collection totaled 23,617.685 meters in length (paper materials accounted for 22,708 meters; non-paper materials for 909.685 meters, including 222.320 meters of photographic materials, 662.455 meters of video and audio tape materials, 13.025 meters of electronic media, 11.885 meters of restructured agency used seals. The numbers and proportions of the various categories of archives are shown in the table on the left and the pie chart below:

Cineaste's Home: Taiwan Film Culture Center

Located in Xinzhuang Fuduxin, the Taiwan Film Culture Center is currently under construction and expected to be completed by 2020. On the construction fences, there is a quote “If you build it, they will come.” which may be from the fantasy-drama sports film “Field of Dreams”.

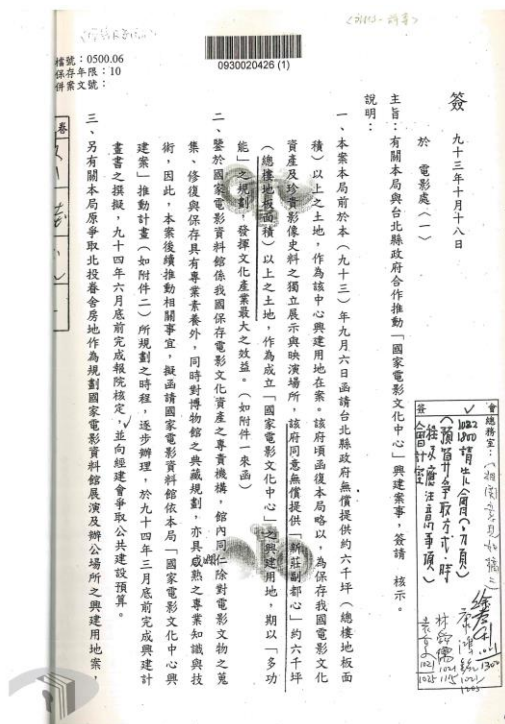


Figure 1: In 2004, the Taipei County Government agreed to offer land in Xinzhuang Fuduxin for free.

The idea of a film center emerged back in 2004. The then Government Information Office, Executive Yuan (GIO) brought up the “National Film Culture Center” project. They soon got the then Taipei County Government (now the New Taipei City Government) to offer over six thousand level ground of land in Xinzhuang Fuduxin for free (Fig. 1). Also, the Kaohsiung City Government offered two hectares of land in Newtaipei Cultural Park Area to GIO for the Southern Branch of the National Film Culture Center in 2006. Eventually, in 2016, the Ministry of Culture (one of the successor agencies to GIO) sealed the deal with the New Taipei City Government. (Fig. 2)

Looking forward to the Taiwan Film Culture Center's completion, there will be a main building within the film park. This Taiwan Film Culture Park Area in Xinzhuang Fuduxin along with the now developing media village in Linkou, will form the New Taipei Media Corridor. For the New Taipei City's citizens, this would mean more job and business opportunities; for Taiwan's film industry, it should be a window for international exchanges.
